Purpose and Overall Outcomes for Sport and Recreation Zone Code

Purpose and Overall Outcomes

(1) The purpose of the Sport and Recreation Zone Code is to provide for a range of organised activities that includes sport, cultural and educational activities where the uses require a level of built infrastructure.

It includes structures such as clubhouses, gymnasiums, public swimming pools, tennis courts, and infrastructure to support recreational and sporting activities and meet community needs.

The code recognises the importance of recreation and open space areas to community liveability and to facilitate the effective operation and optimum accessibility of sport and recreation activities.

(2) The overall outcomes sought for the zone code are as follows:

- (a) areas available for active sport and recreational pursuit such as playing fields, equestrian facilities, outdoor cultural facilities, educational activities, public swimming pools and outdoor courts are provided;
- (b) opportunities for sporting clubs using playing fields to establish club facilities are facilitated;
- (c) development is designed to incorporate sustainable practices including maximising energy efficiency, water conservation and encourages sustainable transport use;
- (d) adverse amenity impacts on adjacent areas from development and activities within the zone are managed through buffering to adjacent sensitive land uses and appropriate design, siting and operation of facilities and infrastructure;
- (e) ancillary structures and buildings such as clubhouses, kiosks, shelters, stands, amenity facilities, picnic tables and playgrounds are provided were necessary to services the needs of the primary use;
- (f) areas of ecological significance, high scenic amenity or cultural heritage are protected from the adverse impacts of sport and recreation activities;
- (g) adverse impacts on ecological values are minimised where recreation and open spaces areas include natural habitats such as bushland, wetlands or waterways, or act as a buffer between natural and developed areas; and
- (h) walking and cycling to recreation and open space areas is encouraged through the provision of paths to, and where appropriate through, the

Response

The proposed TRSP will provide a suite of regional sporting facilities and community spaces that promote the social and economic well-being of the community and encourage further participation in sports. The facility will ensure that Toowoomba continues to service the sporting needs of the Toowoomba, Darling Downs and South-East Queensland regions.

Accordingly, it is considered that the development complies with the purpose of the Sport and Recreation Zone Code.

The proposed development complies with the overall outcomes of the Sport and Recreation Zone as follows:

- The development provides areas for active sport and recreation activities.
 The Infrastructure Entity is proposing to construct facilities for use by sporting clubs, which ensures they do not require the funds to construct their own facilities and allow the facilities to be utilised by a range of sporting
- The development has been designed to incorporate a range of sustainable practices within the design, including recommendations for on-site solar energy generation and storage, recycled water supply for irrigation purposes and open space areas to encourage sustainable and active transport options throughout the facility.
- The TRSP has been designed to ensure it does not adversely impact on the surrounding locality, including people, uses and the environment, and does not affect the existing or future operation/development of surrounding land. Reference is made to the Environmental Assessment at section 8.0.
 - Significant open space areas are provided to encourage active transport options between sporting facilities within the site. Additionally, the open space areas will encourage the community to travel to the site to utilise these areas.

- minimise the potential for conflict between rural uses and other uses;

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- (e) provide for the establishment of appropriately scaled agri- and ecotourism activities that are based on farm life or primary production in the locality, or on the scenic or environmental values of the locality;
- (f) provide for intensive animal industries including feedlots, piggeries and poultry farms; and
 - (g) protect rural land from fragmentation that diminishes its productive capacity.
- (2) The overall outcomes sought for the zone code are as follows:
- (a) areas used or suitable for primary production are conserved and are not further fragmented;
- (b) the establishment of a wide range of rural pursuits is facilitated, including cropping, intensive horticulture, intensive animal industries, animal

The proposed development will utilise two (2) small lots which are located in the Rural Zone, between two (2) existing large rural residential premises which are not currently utilised for primary production purposes. The proposed development complies with the overall outcomes of the Rural Zone Code as follows:

(1) The purpose of the Transport, Access and Parking Code is to ensure development makes appropriate provision for transport, access, parking, servicing and end of trip facilities to meet the needs of development and facilitate, as far as practicable, an environmentally sustainable transport network.

(2) The purpose of the code will be achieved through the following overall outcomes:

(a) the function, safety and efficiency of the transport network is protected or improved;

(b) transport network infrastructure is designed for, in order of priority, pedestrians, cyclists, public transport and private vehicles;

(c) pedestrians (including people with a disability) and cyclists are provided with a high level of accessibility, safety and convenience within a development site and on-site facilities are integrated with external walking and cyclist networks and public transport nodes;

(d) the use of public transport is facilitated wherever practicable;

(e) access, parking, servicing and associated manoeuvring areas are designed to be safe, functional and to meet the reasonable demands generated by the development;

 access, parking, servicing and associated manoeuvring areas do not detract from streetscape character and are designed to discourage crime and anti-social behaviour; (g) adverse impacts on the environment and sensitive receptors are avoided; and

(h) road layout provides for safe and practical connectivity with adjoining land. Editor's note: — Vehicular access points to State-controlled roads require approval under the Transport Infrastructure Act 1994. Access approvals to the State-controlled roads are administered by the Department of Transport and Main Roads in accordance with the Road Planning and Design Manual.

The proposed development has been designed to ensure it makes appropriate in provisions for transport, access, parking, servicing and end of trip facilities to meet and the demands of the development. Reference is made to section 8.7 and the port of traffic Impact Assessment attached at Appendix R.

Accordingly, it is considered that the development complies with the purpose of the Transport, Access and Parking Code.

A Traffic Impact Assessment has been prepared for this development, and attached at **Appendix R**. This report includes an assessment against the Performance and Acceptable Outcomes of the Transport, Access and Parking Code, which found that the proposed generally complies with the intent of this code.

Reference is made to the Environmental Assessment at section 8.0. The proposed development will not impact on existing infrastructure located in proximity to the subject land. Access, parking, roads and pedestrian and cycle paths will be provided to ensure safe, convenient and efficient operation of movement networks. Reference is made to the Traffic Impact Assessment attached at Appendix R. Infrastructure, services and utilities associated with the facility will not detract from the environmental values, desired character or amenity of the locality.
